

## ***FORTHM Collective Short-Term Mobility***

### **Winter school on Belonging and Non-Belonging in Europe**

**Organising university:** University of Jyväskylä

**Location of the event:** Jyväskylä, Finland

**Organisers:** The Winter School is jointly organised by the FORTHM Experiencing Europe and Diversity and Migration labs. The leading organisers are the local lab leaders Prof. Tuuli Lähdesmäki, Dr. Vasileios Syros (Experiencing Europe) and Dr. Hanna-Mari Kivistö (Diversity and Migration) together with an organising team of scholars and students.

**Project description:** The Winter School brings together MA and doctoral students, researchers, teachers and stakeholders to discuss diverse aspects of (feeling of) belonging or non-belonging in/to Europe/the EU, such as:

- the position and role of minorities and migrants in Europe;
- human rights of vulnerable migrants in/seeking to arrive in Europe;
- perceptions of the (so called) refugee crisis, right to asylum and language of asylum;
- different aspects of diversities, othering, borders and bordering in Europe;
- shared cultural space in Europe and discourse of European cultural heritage, history, and memory;
- representations and narratives on Europe and the European in (social) media, culture, and art; hate speech;
- notions of Europe and the European in political rhetoric and action in national parliaments or polities;
- EU discourse and actions on Europe and the European

**Day by day programme:** The Winter School takes place on 21-25 February 2022. The programme of the five-day event will include:

- lectures given by researchers/teachers from partner universities;
- students' presentations of their papers;
- discussions of and feedback to the papers by peers and researchers/teachers;
- lectures by local stakeholders;
- visits and short excursions to cultural sites in Jyväskylä and NGOs promoting diversity, manifold approaches to Europe and integration activities for migrants

#### **Eligibility criteria and selection criteria specific to this project:**

Attachments needed: CV, one-page research project description, statement from supervisor

The applicants will be asked to attach a CV, one-page description of their MA or PhD project, and a statement from their supervisor. Prospective participants will be selected based on their merits and thematic suitability, considering the statement from the supervisor and equal distribution of participants between different universities and MA and doctoral students.
